

Christian and Barbara (Luginbuhl) Schumacher built their northwest Ohio homestead in the 1840s-1850s after immigrating from Switzerland.

Their son Peter and his wife Elizabeth would raise sixteen children there. Elizabeth (Suter) Schumacher was later commemorated by Ripley's "Believe It or Not" for having 163 grandchildren!
